

What should you bring for a week in Haiti?

Clothing:

Because of the hot and humid tropical climate in Haiti, it is best to bring cotton and/or other breathable fabrics.

Apart from traveling attire, we suggest you pack:

Comfortable walking shoes--sneakers, sandals, crocs, etc. and one pair of shoes suitable for nice occasions.

(Basically, bring one extra pair of shoes apart from your travel attire.)

- □ Flip flops, slides or "shower shoes"
- □ Bathing suit
- □ Bandanna/Hat
- □ Sweat shirt or long-sleeved shirt for chilly evenings in the mountains
- □ Light rain jacket (optional May October, not needed otherwise)
- □ Lightweight sleeping attire
- □ Sunglasses

Men:

- □ A shirt for every day you're in Haiti, at least one long-sleeved button down.
- \Box 2 or 3 pairs of shorts (three days in Haiti = two pairs of shorts).
- □ 1 or 2 pairs of lightweight long pants, one pair that's suitable for a nice occasion.

Women:

- □ A shirt for every day you're in Haiti
- □ Five pairs of pants and shorts or skirts/dresses (everything of modest length).
- □ *At least one skirt or dress should be appropriate for a nice occasion.*

Toiletries:

□ Shampoo

 \Box Deodorant

 $\hfill\square$ Toothpaste and toothbrush

 \Box Sunscreen

□ Wet Wipes

□ Hand Sanitizer

 $\hfill\square$ Any other hygiene products you need for personal care

Medical Supplies:

We will have a first-aid kit on hand.

- $\hfill\square$ Prescription medications in original containers
- □ Anti-Malaria medication if you decide to − Please consult your physician
- □ BandAids
- □ Dramamine (if you are prone to motion sickness--plane, bus or boat)
- □ Pepto-Bismol tablets
- □ Anti-diarrhea medicine
- $\hfill\square$ Insect repellent

Additional things you may wish to consider bringing:

Travel documentation:

- □ Email flight information to gcomsara@gmail.com so that we have a record.
- □ Passport
- □ Address for where you are staying in Haiti, please check with your assigned trip leader. You will need this to fill out documents on the plane. Good Ideas / Optional:
 - □ Record of vaccinations

Electronics:

- □ Laptop (Wi-Fi available at guesthouse)
- □ Smartphone/camera and/or video camera

Other:

- □ Bible
- $\hfill\square$ Notebook and Pens

□ Earplugs (for night noises)

□ Haitian-Creole resource

□ Pictures of your family (to share with new friends)

□ Snacks

□ Small gifts are sometimes appropriate

(flashlights, USB flash drives, jump ropes, jacks, balls, bubbles, etc.)

Money:

Your meals, lodging and in-country transportation are covered with the money you've paid to GCOM for your trip.

□ We suggest that you have a minimum of \$150 in cash (small bills: 5's, 10's, 1's) Beautiful Haitian crafts will be available, and can range greatly in price for wooden carvings, paintings, etc.

Credit Cards: Hotels, restaurants and grocery stores accept major credit cards
